




1. Yonekawa Mizukaburi (first Horse day of February on the old Japanese calendar)/ Wearing hats and braided ropes made of straw, with soot and ink on their faces, these men act as messengers of the gods. They run through town and splash water from pre-prepared buckets onto the roofs of houses to ward off fire. This is both a nationally designated important national intangible folk cultural property, and a UNESCO-registered intangible cultural property. 2. The Shotaro Ishinomori Memorial Museum/ A display of the works and personal effects of the famous manga artist Shotaro Ishinomori, responsible for many influential works such as Cyborg 009 and Kamen Rider. 3. Woodworks/ Located downstream of the great Kitakami river, Tome City is known as a collection point of lumber and base point for ships. Here you can see many original woodworks, primarily furniture made from Tsuyama cedar, in a beautiful fletching pattern. 4. Views of farmland/ Enjoy a beautiful view of the rice paddies that changes with each season. Rice growing has an old history here, producing the most rice in Miyagi prefecture.

5. Ishikoshi Sake Brewery/ A brewery representing Tome City, brewing with medium hardness water from its own well, and high-quality rice, perfectly suited for making sake. 6. Fresh eel/ The popular eel rice boxes, made with eel caught from the Kitakami River in front of you, can be eaten in eel stores along the river banks. The fish's meat has a dense, but fluffy taste to it. 7. Tome Beef/ Much care is taken every day to grow each cow and produce delicious beef, such as feeding them mochi rice and ground charcoal daily. 8. Environmentally friendly rice/ The environmentally friendly brand of rice that first began in Tome. This rice is grown with reduced pesticides and artificial fertiliser, to reduce strain on the environment.

clan, one of the families of the old Sendai Date clan. The area around Tome is filled with Meiji era constructions, and is known as Miyagi's Meiji village. Tour the streets and take in the air of the Meiji days. The Education Museum was created as a primary-and-high-school in 1888 (Meiji 21). Step into the white balconies of its blended western-Japanese construction, and see its old-fashioned space spread out before you. Two minutes from here will take you to the Mizusawa Prefectural Office Memorial, built in 1871 (Meiji 4). This is a very important building representing the construction of prefectural offices of the time, where you can reach out and touch history directly.

Tome City is formerly the castle city belonging to the Tome-Date

Within walking range from it, you can find the fashionable construction of the Police Museum, as well as the Tome Kaikokan (moved and rebuilt according to architect Kengo Sumi's designs in Sept 2019), which houses many artifacts of the Date family.

At the Mori Butai Noh Theatre and Museum, built to showcase the Toyoma-Noh style passed down since the Edo era (17th century), you can see the origins of Noh theatre on display. Finally, one place you should be sure to visit is the Katsuko Takakura Art Gallery Sakura Avenue. Here you can enjoy Japanese and watercolour paintings depicting traditional farming villages. The six facilities can also be entered with a shared ticket between them.

■ Byodo-numa Fureai Park/ The Fureai Bridge constructed across the middle of the wetland is 188 metres long. From it, you can overlook every cherry blossom in the wetlands. During the night, lights are lit up amid the trees, giving them a fantastical appearance. Temple Cafe Muso-an/ A comfortable space where you can feel nature all around you. Offers ritually purified soba noodles, and parfaits made with Aburafu (a sort of fried gluten dish). Toyoma Forest Park forest therapy/ The first forest certified as a forest therapy base in Miyagi prefecture. Explore the Therapeutic Road and bask in the forest therapy experience.

Hatto

Famous for its delicious noodles. Put it in the soy sauce-based soup, or wrap it up in sweet green or red bean paste.



Aburafu Bowl

Sauce-soaked aburafu, onion and soft-cooked egg combine with Tome rice to make a wonderful taste that warms you from the inside out.

Aburafu is made from fermented gluten paste, which is turned into sticks and fried in vegetable oil.

### Museum Meiji Village Museum of Miyagi

Filled with fashionable western-style construction and old-fashioned shop-houses to this day, the look of the town has caused it to be named the Miyaqi Meiji Village.



### Memorial Museum | Shotaro Ishinomori Memorial Museum

A museum for the manga artist Shotaro Ishinomori, famous for works such as Kamen Rider. With video theatres and libraries, this facility has much to offer even for non-fans.


The 'hatto' is Tome's local dish. Here you'll see over 30 varieties, from classics to sweet versions.
